The core of this position includes teaching physics main lessons, electives, and labs in grades 7-12. The position also includes mathematics teaching in the same grades.

Strong candidates will possess a degree in physics or a related science and will have teaching experience, ideally in a Waldorf high school. As a member of the Upper School faculty, the science teacher will work collaboratively with colleagues on a daily basis and in regular departmental, area, and all-school meetings. Additional responsibilities include advising students, travelling with classes on school trips, and continued professional development.
